A Document from the 1863 Sampson County Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions: "An Oder for Sale of slaves"

I have an order granting permission for John N. Jackson to sell Harriet and her son, Thomas, two enslaved individuals who belonged to Jackson's ward, Mary J. Bagget [also spelled Baggett]. Here are pictures of the document. (See attached photos.) It is a petition from the Sampson County Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions that was heard during its November 1863 Term. The Court granted permission for Jackson to sell two of Ms. Bagget's enslaved people, Harriet and Thomas, Harriet's child, if Jackson announced his intentions at three or more public places for no less than ten days. The following is the transcription of the original document:
