Worth, and one of the most highly esteemed women of this city, died at the Confederate home here yesterday afternoon, in her 69th year of her age. Mrs. Worth had been ill for age. Stuart chapter of the United Daughters of the Confederacy and always a devoted daughter of the south. The office of historian of the local chapter was held by her for many years. Both her father, with a Mississippi regiment, and her hus-band, with the North Carolina troops, were members of the Confederate

forces.

Mrs. Worth was, the daughter of Josiah and Sarah Hodges Bryan, of Fayetteville. She is survived by a son, John W. Worth, well known musician, and organist and choirmaster of the Church of the Advocate, New York city; and a granddaughter, Josephine Martin, of Fayetteville. She was a woman of strong character, exceptional culture, and gracious perceptional culture, and gracious per-sonality. She was a gifted musician and possessed considerable ability as a writer. Many friends will be sad-

dened by her death.

The funeral was held at 4 o'clock this afternoon from St. John's Episcopal church, of which she was a devoted member.
